

ACADEMIC OPPORTUNITIES

NEWS FLASH: ATTENDANCE POLICY

For students who have 5 or more absences in a class period in a nine week period, students must validate the absence to avoid receiving a FF for the class due to attendance. (No more than 10 days in a given semester.)

It is the responsibility of the student on the first day of his/her return to school following an absence to arrange for make-up time and/or work. All assigned make-up work will be completed outside of regular class time within 3 school days (except in the case of consecutive multiple absences).

Students are expected to arrive to class on time. Arriving to class late may result in disciplinary actions from **me**. Excessive tardiness will result in an administrative referral.
